QUALIFICATION STATEMENT

Membership in IEA is mandatory; only teams and individuals who have previously qualified in accordance with IEA rules may compete. Coaches and riders should confirm their eligibility with the IEA membership office before submitting entries.

Hunt Seat Individual Class Descriptions

Jumping Classes

- H2a. Varsity Open Equitation o/f 2'6" – Riders should be capable of jumping 3'-3'6" on their usual mounts at home. Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 3'3" or above. Coaches should be confident these riders could safely perform over a 2'6" hunter or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.
- H3a. Varsity Intermediate Equitation o/f 2' – Riders should be capable of jumping 2'6"-3' on their usual mounts at home. Intermediate Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 3' or below. Riders who have won 10 or more blue ribbons at 3' must be placed in Varsity Open O/F. Coaches should be confident these riders would be able to safely perform over 2' hunter or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.
- H4a. Junior Varsity Novice Equitation o/f x-rails – Riders should be capable of jumping 2'-2'6" on their usual mounts at home. Junior Varsity Novice Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 2'6" or below. Riders who have won 10 or more blue ribbons at 2'6" MUST BE PLACED IN THE NEXT HIGHER APPROPRIATE LEVEL. Riders should have a minimum of one-year of professional instruction over fences. Coaches should be confident these riders would be able to safely perform over an x-rails hunter course or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.
- H5a. Future Intermediate Equitation o/f 2' – Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Hunt Seat Class 3.
- H6a. Future Novice o/f x-rails - Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Hunt Seat Class 4.

Flat Classes

[Note: Riders without jumping experience should be assessed according to their ability to perform flatwork tests, as listed in Rule 3(D).]

- H8a. Varsity Open Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 13.
- H9a. Varsity Intermediate Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 9.
- H10a. Junior Varsity Novice Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 8.
- H11a. Junior Varsity Beginner Equitation on the flat WTC – Open to riders who have been riding less than 4 calendar years, who are not eligible for any jumping classes, but should be experienced enough to canter an unfamiliar animal in a group. These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 7, and may have shown at any unrecognized horse show. A Beginner rider may not have shown over fences larger than 2' in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized. A rider who is in their first year of showing over cross rails may still be considered eligible for this class. To be eligible for Class 11, a rider must have had at least one year continuous professional instruction.
- H12a. Future Intermediate Equitation on the flat – Restricted to middle school riders who are capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 9.
- H13a. Future Novice Equitation on the flat – Restricted to middle school riders who are capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 8.
- H14a. Future Beginner Equitation on the flat WTC – Restricted to middle school riders who meet the eligibility requirements of Class 11.

Championship Class

- H15. Varsity Open Championship Class– The top Varsity Open riders as determined by points and places within the show are eligible for this class. The class requires a minimum of 6 riders, and should be limited to the top 10. Riders must be eligible to complete in Varsity Open Over Fences (2'6") to be eligible for this championship class. The class may be run using the same mount for both phases of the competition, or a separate draw may be done for each phase. The judge may choose to implement any additional testing after the completion of the 2 mandatory phases. Phase 1 – Riders will be judged over an advanced equitation course with jumps from 2'6" to 3'. Hunt seat tests 1-13 may be asked. Phase 2 – Riders will also compete on the Flat and may be asked to perform any of tests 1-11.

Hunt Seat Upper School Team Class Descriptions

Jumping Classes

- H2b. Varsity Open Equitation o/f 2'6" – Riders should be capable of jumping 3'-3'6" on their usual mounts at home. Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 3'3" or above. Coaches should be confident these riders could safely perform over a 2'6" hunter or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.
- H3b. Varsity Intermediate Equitation o/f 2' – Riders should be capable of jumping 2'6"-3' on their usual mounts at home. Intermediate Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 3' or below. Riders who have won 10 or more blue ribbons at 3' must be placed in Varsity Open O/F. Coaches should be confident these riders would be able to safely perform over 2' hunter or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.
- H4b. Junior Varsity Novice Equitation o/f x-rails – Riders should be capable of jumping 2'-2'6" on their usual mounts at home. Junior Varsity Novice Riders may have shown in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized, at 2'6" or below. Riders who have won 10 or more blue ribbons at 2'6" MUST BE PLACED IN THE NEXT HIGHER APPROPRIATE LEVEL. Riders should have a minimum of one-year of professional instruction over fences. Coaches should be confident these riders would be able to safely perform over an x-rails hunter course or equitation course on an unfamiliar horse.

Flat Classes

- H8b. Varsity Open Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 13.
- H9b. Varsity Intermediate Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 9.
- H10b. Junior Varsity Novice Equitation on the flat – These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 8.
- H11b. Junior Varsity Beginner Equitation on the flat WTC – Open to riders who have been riding less than 4 calendar years, who are not eligible for any jumping classes, but should be experienced enough to canter an unfamiliar animal in a group. These riders should be capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 7, and may have shown at any unrecognized horse show. A Beginner rider may not have shown over fences larger than 2' in any horse show, recognized or unrecognized. A rider who is in their first year of showing over cross rails may still be considered eligible for this class. To be eligible for Class 11, a rider must have had at least one year continuous professional instruction.

Hunt Seat Middle School Team Class Descriptions

Jumping Classes

- H5b. Future Intermediate Equitation o/f 2' – Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Hunt Seat Class 3.
- H6b. Future Novice o/f x-rails - Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Hunt Seat Class 4.

Flat Classes

- H12b. Future Intermediate Equitation on the flat – Restricted to middle school riders who are capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 9.
- H13b. Future Novice Equitation on the flat – Restricted to middle school riders who are capable of performing Hunt Seat Tests 1 through 8.
- H14b. Future Beginner Equitation on the flat WTC – Restricted to middle school riders who meet the eligibility requirements of Class 11.

IEA Hunt Seat Rider Tests

A rider must be prepared to perform the test appropriate for the class in which the rider is participating. Riders may be requested to perform the following tests collectively or individually during a show or competition. No other tests may be used. The judge may choose only from the following list, and instructions for performance of the test must be publicly announced.

1. Asked an appropriate question.
2. Halt
3. Sitting trot.
4. Two point position at the walk and/or trot.
5. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals.
6. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead.
7. Change Horses
8. Ride without stirrups.
9. Change leads down center of ring, demonstrating simple change of lead.
10. Canter on the counter lead. No more than eight horses may counter canter at one time.
11. Half-turn on forehand and/or half-turn on haunches.
12. Jump a shortened course.
13. Trot a jump not to exceed 2'6".

Horsemanship Test for Huntseat and Western Riders:

The Holy Innocents' Episcopal School Horsemanship Award was created to promote good horsemanship among IEA equestrian athletes. It is intended to compliment the IEA's mission to educate younger equestrians in all areas of equestrian studies and focuses on the belief that horsemanship always comes first.

How to Participate:

1. The National Test will be available to all exhibitors at the IEA National Finals and will be administered on Saturday in a ringside area of the show. (See time schedule.) There is no entry fee to take the test.
2. There will be 2 versions of the written test: one for huntseat riders and one for western riders. The top three highest scoring exhibitors will be invited to a hands-on Horsemanship Test on Saturday at the end of the competition-approximately 5:00pm.
3. The winner receiving the highest overall score will receive a perpetual trophy and a \$250 monetary grant to further their equestrian education. Awards will be announced mid-day on Sunday.

Western Individual Class Descriptions

Horsemanship Classes

- W2a. Varsity Open Horsemanship: Riders who have competed at nationally qualifying competitions such as, but not limited to, youth team or world show qualifying competitions. Also, riders who have won NRHA or AQHA world top 5 placing or any rider with a top 5 placing at the All American Quarter Horse Congress, Paint, appaloosa, and other breed show equivalents. Showmanship, halter, hunt seat, and contest classes are excluded. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-10.
- W3a. Varsity Intermediate Horsemanship: These riders are those who have won 5 or more blue ribbons in western horsemanship or reining in breed or National Reining Horse associations, for example: Quarter Horse, Paint, and Appaloosa and NRHA shows. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-8.
- W4a. Junior Varsity Novice Horsemanship: These riders may have shown at open shows and non-breed specific shows, for example, 4H events and county fairs. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-6.
- W5a. Junior Varsity Beginner Horsemanship: These riders have no formal show experience. Riders may have shown at farm shows and camp shows. Riders are safe to walk, jog, and lope in a group on an unfamiliar mount. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-5.
- W6a. Future Intermediate Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Western Horsemanship Class 3 and/or are capable of performing western tests 1-8.
- W7a. Future Novice Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Western Horsemanship Class 4 and/or who are capable of performing western tests 1-6.
- W8a. Future Beginner Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who have no formal show experience. Riders may have shown at farm shows and camps shows, and are safe to walk, jog, and lope in a group on an unfamiliar mount. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-5.

Reining Classes

- W10a. Varsity Open Reining: Restricted to those riders competing in the Varsity Open Horsemanship. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 2 to be eligible to show in this class.
- W11a. Varsity Intermediate Reining: Restricted to riders competing in Varsity Intermediate Horsemanship. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 3 to be eligible to show in this class.
- W12a. Futures Intermediate Reining: Restricted to riders competing in the Futures Intermediate Horsemanship Class. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 6 to be eligible to show in this class.

Western Upper School Team Class Descriptions

Horsemanship Classes

- W2b. Varsity Open Horsemanship: Riders who have competed at nationally qualifying competitions such as, but not limited to, youth team or world show qualifying competitions. Also, riders who have won NRHA or AQHA world top 5 placing or any rider with a top 5 placing at the All American Quarter Horse Congress, Paint, appaloosa, and other breed show equivalents. Showmanship, halter, hunt seat, and contest classes are excluded. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-10.
- W3b. Varsity Intermediate Horsemanship: These riders are those who have won 5 or more blue ribbons in western horsemanship or reining in breed or National Reining Horse associations, for example: Quarter Horse, Paint, and Appaloosa and NRHA shows. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-8.
- W4b. Junior Varsity Novice Horsemanship: These riders may have shown at open shows and non-breed specific shows, for example, 4H events and county fairs. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-6.
- W5b. Junior Varsity Beginner Horsemanship: These riders have no formal show experience. Riders may have shown at farm shows and camp shows. Riders are safe to walk, jog, and lope in a group on an unfamiliar mount. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-5.

Reining Classes

- W10b. Varsity Open Reining: Restricted to those riders competing in the Varsity Open Horsemanship. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 2 to be eligible to show in this class.
- W11b. Varsity Intermediate Reining: Restricted to riders competing in Varsity Intermediate Horsemanship. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 3 to be eligible to show in this class.

Western Middle School Team Class Descriptions

Horsemanship Classes

- W6b. Future Intermediate Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Western Horsemanship Class 3 and/or are capable of performing western tests 1-8.
- W7b. Future Novice Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who meet the criteria for Western Horsemanship Class 4 and/or who are capable of performing western tests 1-6.
- W8b. Future Beginner Horsemanship: Restricted to middle school riders who have no formal show experience. Riders may have shown at farm shows and camps shows, and are safe to walk, jog, and lope in a group on an unfamiliar mount. These riders should be capable of performing western tests 1-5.

Reining Classes

- W12b. Future Intermediate Reining: Restricted to riders competing in the Futures Intermediate Horsemanship Class. Riders must compete in Western Horsemanship Class 6 to be eligible to show in this class.

Western Horsemanship Tests

A western judge may choose from the following horsemanship tests. Any one or combination of appropriate or equivalent tests may be used.

1. Individual performance on the rail.
2. Halt and/or back
3. Figure eight at the jog
4. Change horses
5. Lope on specific lead and stop
6. 360 degree turn
7. Figure eight at the lope, demonstrating a change of lead (through the walk or jog)
8. Ride without stirrups
9. Simple change of leads in a straight line
10. Counter canter

General Rules Responsibility:

In exchange for entrance to and participation in the show, this entry constitutes an agreement and affirmation that the team making it, and each of its riders, coaches, trainers, and representatives shall accept and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the IEA and of the Show, and that each rider, coach and Team: (1) is a member in good standing of IEA, (2) is eligible as entered, and (3) will accept as final all rulings of IEA and the show steward (or committee) with respect to their conduct. Also, through participation each rider, **rider's parents/legal guardians**, coach, trainer, and participant acknowledges **THAT HORSES ARE INTRINSICALLY DANGEROUS AND UNPREDICTABLE AND CAN CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH**, thus each agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless IEA, its officers, directors, members, employees, Executive Director, National Steward, agents and representatives, the Event Host Coordinator, the host team and facility, the show stewards, stewards committee members, the show judges, the show secretary, all show organizers and officials, and all persons, stables, and others providing facilities, horses or equipment for the Show, other riders, coaches, teams and team sponsoring institutions, from any claim, action or suit, for injury, property damage or death sustained by the individual, rider, entity, coach, trainer, or participant while traveling to, from and around the show, while staying in the city for the show, during participation in the show and while at the show. This entry constitutes an acceptance of the hired officials at this event."

Entries:

Entries will not be accepted without an IEA number listed for each rider.

Entries will be considered received only with full payment. Entries will open immediately upon electronic distribution of prize list. Entries will close, and must be received by **April 6, 2010**. Each individual rider will be charged **\$50** per class, each team rider will be charged **\$50** per class. There is no entry fee for Varsity Open Championship. Scratches can be made with full refund before closing date. Checks should be made payable to Interscholastic Equestrian Association. A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entries; please include a valid email address in the space provided on the entry form for this purpose.

Victor Hugo-Vidal Sportsmanship Award:

Each team represented may nominate one entered rider for the Sportsmanship Award. This rider will wear an armband and entry number throughout the weekend, and at the conclusion of National Finals the judging committee will announce the winner of the Sportsmanship Award. Only one rider per each team entity may be nominated.

Format:

The general format will follow the Rules and Regulations as established by the IEA unless otherwise stated. However, if a topic is not covered by these Rules and Regulations, the rules and regulations of the Intercollegiate Horse Show Association ["IHSA"] and the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. ["USEF"] for the Hunt Seat Division and the American Quarter Horse Association ["AQHA"] and the National Reining Horse Association ["NRHA"] for the Western Division may be used as a reference for guidance in making an equitable decision under the circumstances. Any decisions made by a steward or show management shall be final.

Horses and Order of Go will be assigned by a random draw on the day of competition. Before jumping classes, each rider will be allowed only two warm-up fences, in the pattern posted by the show steward. Warm-up fences may only be changed by a steward or show official. All classes will be judged on equitation, and faults of the horse will not be judged. If a horse should perform so poorly that it is impossible to fairly judge the rider, the judge may request a re-ride. Any other requests for re-rides will be determined by the steward.

-All Hunt Seat Riders must wear ATSM approved protective headgear whenever mounted.

-It is mandatory for all riders to use appropriate western tack and western attire while showing; this would include a long sleeve shirt, western hat or safety helmet, boots, western saddle, and western bridle. (Freestyle reining being exempt based on conditions.) Failure to use appropriate attire will result in a score of zero.

Awards:

-The Leading Rider Award will be given to the winner of the Varsity Open Championship Class.
